



FirefighterApp Expands Recruiting Reach for Tiverton Fire Department

THE CHALLENGE:

The Tiverton Fire Department, located in Newport County, Rhode Island, has 28 uniformed members responding to fire, medical, hazardous material, public service and water rescue calls from three stations in three response districts.

Before implementing FirefighterApp.com, the Tiverton Fire Department received just 25-30 applications per year, mostly through word of mouth. "Our inability to reach a larger audience gave us a very poor return on potential applicants," explained Chief Robert D. Lloyd. "Once all testing, background checks and interviews were completed, we were left with few possible candidates."

In one recent recruitment effort, a hiring ad was placed in two local papers as mandated by the town charter. The department received 21 applicants and invited 11 to take a written exam. Of the nine that showed up to take the test, only five passed. Once further screening and background checks were completed, only one was eligible to be hired.

According to Lloyd, implementing FirefighterApp.com was a smooth process.
